



The Pack: Cultural Preservation Policy

PROTECTING MUSICAL DIVERSITY

Preamble

The Pack recognises that musical diversity is fundamental to human cultural expression and that this diversity is increasingly threatened by algorithm-driven homogenisation, commercial pressures, and digital disruption. This policy establishes our commitment to actively preserving, celebrating, and nurturing diverse musical traditions, practices, and communities. We believe that protecting musical diversity is not just a cultural imperative but a necessary foundation for artistic innovation and authentic expression.

CORE COMMITMENTS

1. LOCAL MUSIC PRESERVATION

The Pack commits to creating and maintaining comprehensive digital archives of local music scenes that preserve cultural heritage for future generations.

Implementation Strategies:

- **Community-Led Archiving:** Partnering with local music communities to identify, collect, and preserve significant recordings, ephemera, and oral histories
- **Digitisation Programs:** Providing technical resources and expertise to digitise at-risk analogue recordings, particularly those from underrepresented communities
- **Historical Context Documentation:** Creating comprehensive metadata systems that preserve the social, cultural, and historical context of archived materials
- **Local Scene Mapping:** Documenting the interconnections between artists, venues, labels, and audiences that constitute local music ecosystems
- **Public Access Frameworks:** Developing appropriate access protocols that respect rights and cultural sensitivities while making archives available for education and research
- **Technical Preservation Standards:** Implementing archival-grade digital preservation practices to ensure long-term viability of musical heritage

2. DOCUMENTATION SUPPORT

The Pack commits to providing resources that enable artists to thoroughly document their creative processes, influences, and contexts.



Implementation Strategies:

- **Creator Documentation Toolkit:** Providing artists with accessible tools and templates for documenting their creative journeys
- **Oral History Program:** Supporting the recording of interviews and narratives from influential musicians, particularly elders and tradition-bearers
- **Process Capture Grants:** Offering financial support for documenting innovative or traditional creative methodologies
- **Contextual Metadata Systems:** Developing expanded metadata frameworks that accommodate cultural context, influence networks, and artistic lineages
- **Technical Training:** Offering workshops on documentation best practices and technologies
- **Collaborative Knowledge Systems:** Creating platforms for artists to document shared influences and interconnections
- **Attribution Frameworks:** Developing systems that properly acknowledge traditional knowledge and influences

3. GENRE EQUALITY

The Pack commits to ensuring that our platform gives equal visibility to diverse musical traditions, not just commercially viable genres.

Implementation Strategies:

- **Anti-Bias Algorithm Design:** Creating recommendation and discovery systems that actively counterbalance commercial pressures
- **Genre Representation Audits:** Regular evaluation of platform content to identify underrepresented genres and traditions
- **Equal Promotion Commitment:** Ensuring featured content, playlists, and promotional materials reflect diverse musical traditions
- **Specialised Curation:** Developing expert-led curation for traditional and niche genres
- **Cross-Genre Discovery Tools:** Creating systems that facilitate discovery across genre boundaries
- **Community-Led Classification:** Working with musical communities to develop genre taxonomies that respect cultural understandings
- **Contextual Education:** Providing accessible information about the history and significance of diverse musical traditions

4. LANGUAGE DIVERSITY

The Pack commits to supporting music in all languages, with particular emphasis on Indigenous and minority languages under threat.



Implementation Strategies:

- **Multilingual Interface:** Developing platform interfaces in multiple languages
- **Language Revitalisation Partnerships:** Collaborating with language revitalisation initiatives to support music as a vehicle for language preservation
- **Enhanced Metadata for Languages:** Creating specialised metadata systems that accurately identify language, dialect, and linguistic elements
- **Language-Specific Features:** Developing features that celebrate and highlight music in endangered languages
- **Youth Engagement Programs:** Supporting initiatives that encourage young musicians to create in heritage languages

SPECIALISED PROVISIONS

First Nations' Musical Heritage

The Pack recognises the unique importance of First Nations' musical traditions and implements specific measures to support their preservation:

1. **First Nations Governance:** Ensuring Indigenous communities maintain authority over how their musical heritage is preserved and shared
2. **Cultural Protocols:** Respecting and implementing appropriate protocols for access to and use of Indigenous musical recordings
3. **Intergenerational Transmission:** Supporting programs that facilitate the passing of musical knowledge between generations
4. **Traditional Knowledge Protection:** Implementing systems that protect against misappropriation of Indigenous musical expressions
5. **Indigenous Data Sovereignty:** Ensuring Indigenous communities maintain control over data related to their musical heritage

Endangered Musical Traditions

For musical traditions identified as endangered, The Pack implements enhanced preservation strategies:

1. **Critical Documentation:** Prioritising comprehensive documentation of at-risk musical forms
2. **Master-Apprentice Support:** Funding transmission of knowledge between tradition bearers and new generations
3. **Contextual Preservation:** Documenting not just the music but the social contexts and functions of endangered traditions
4. **Revival Initiatives:** Supporting community-led efforts to revive endangered musical practices



5. **Performance Contexts:** Preserving knowledge about traditional performance contexts and practices
6. **Holistic Approach:** Recognising the interconnection between music and other cultural elements (dance, ritual, storytelling)

Regional Music Ecosystems

The Pack acknowledges the importance of regional music scenes and implements measures to support their documentation and preservation:

1. **Regional Scene Mapping:** Creating comprehensive documentation of regional music networks and infrastructure
2. **Local Industry Documentation:** Preserving the history of local labels, studios, and music businesses
3. **Regional Style Recognition:** Developing systems that recognise and celebrate distinct regional musical styles
4. **Scene Interconnections:** Documenting how local scenes connect to and influence broader musical communities

IMPLEMENTATION FRAMEWORKS

Cultural Preservation Council

The Pack will establish a Cultural Preservation Council comprised of:

- Community music leaders
- Archivists and preservation specialists
- Indigenous culture bearers
- Regional music scene members
- Language preservation experts

The Council will:

- Establish preservation priorities and strategies
- Allocate resources for preservation initiatives
- Develop best practices for ethical documentation
- Evaluate program effectiveness

Community Partnership Model

The Pack adopts a community partnership model for cultural preservation that:

- Centres community priorities and knowledge
- Builds local capacity for preservation work



- Shares technical expertise while respecting cultural authority
- Creates sustainable, community-driven preservation programs
- Ensures benefits flow back to source communities

Technical Infrastructure

Our commitment to cultural preservation will be supported by:

- Archival-grade digital storage systems
- Open-source documentation tools
- Accessible community interfaces
- Appropriate security measures for sensitive materials
- Redundant preservation strategies
- Metadata systems that accommodate cultural complexity

ACCOUNTABILITY AND EVALUATION

The Pack commits to:

- Annual public reporting on cultural preservation initiatives
- Regular evaluation of preservation program effectiveness
- Ongoing consultation with affected communities
- Transparent documentation of preservation methodologies
- Regular review and updating of this policy
